

This will be mind blowing.

With support from Digi Youth Arts, an acknowledgment of the lands and country will open the event, as well as a representative from the Brisbane City Council.

Lord Mayor Graham Quirk said Brisbane City Council was proud to support the Brisbane Street Art Festival, which added to Brisbane's reputation as a great place to live, work and relax.

"Public art contributes to a vibrant Brisbane and brings our city's infrastructure alive, while providing new opportunities for our city's talented emerging artists," Cr Quirk said.

Launch Event Acknowledgment of Country by Digi Youth Arts: before the walls: We dream in futures. We care about tomorrows. We paint for generations. The festival director, Lincoln Savage, will also welcome you to the opening of our biggest BSAF yet. Not only will there be live painting, but accompanying local musical talents from The Gametes, Desmond Cheese, YELLOWCATREDCAT and Feelsclub.

SCRIBBLE SLAM

The launch event will also see the revival of Scribble Slam, a live art battle to exist at Ric's Backyard once a month. The first round of Scribble Slam at Ric's will host the incredible talents of EJ Zyla and Bao Ho from Hong Kong; with MC support, Shani Finch, giving attendees an unmissable blow by blow of street artists in action.

The event showcases two artists battling against each other, working with a 90 minute time limit, and each creating their own artwork on a $2.4 \text{m} \times 2.4 \text{m}$ wall.

The two artists involved are able to use whichever medium they like to create an artwork. Both artists will be completely unaware of what they will be painting until the countdown timer is started. The element of the 'unknown' lends Scribble Slam a sense of intensity and intrigue that draws a diverse crowd of art apprecionados.


ARTIST PARTY

SAID DOKINS (MEXICO)

Said Dokins lives and Works in Mexico City.

Dokins started doing graffiti and street interventions since the 90s. This experience led him to the School of Arts, where he was interested in conceptual art and the relation between art and writing. He did some studies of Philosophy and Art Theory. He has also done courses of traditional Western and Japanese calligraphy.

He is best known for his unique calligraphic style, which combines elements from Western and Asian Calligraphic Traditions, with pre-phonetic writing references, Mesoamerican Pre-Hispanic symbolic inheritance and Graffiti, combining precision and discipline with expressiveness and spontaneity.

Dokins explores formally, symbolically and philosophically the potentiality of words and letters. In his work, they become gestures, traces that overlap creating patterns, textures, narratives; marks that carve sites, drawing boundaries, producing meaning. In that sense, for Dokins calligraphy and graffiti are a way to understand our relations with language, an action

that stresses time, space and memory, a political enunciation.

His artistic practice involves several disciplines and media such as calligraphy, graffiti, installation, performance, video art and light experimentation. His work has been exhibited nationally and internationally, in countries as Spain, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, United Kingdom, France, Argentina, Chile, Brazil, El Salvador, Peru and others. 
ASHLEY PEEL



GUS EAGLETON



Art Atlas is a crowd-sourced archival and documentation system for public art around the world. Built by Vast Yonder in collaboration with BSAF, and made possible through funding by the 2016 Brisbane City Council Innovation Award, Art Atlas has grown from a simple concept into a worldwide platform for street artists and the general public to display their own works and appreciate pieces in an adventurous map context.

Users upload photos of street artworks they discover with geographic reference on Art Atlas's world map, making it possible for other users to

either browse a city's dappled works online or find the physical work itself. By including databases of artists featured, street artists are also given a platform to share their hidden portfolio in a way previously unheard of, ultimately creating a worldwide street art community which allows artists to gain recognition throughout the globe. Art Atlas is live on Apple Itunes App Store and Google play, growing through increasing numbers of artists and art devotees uploading fresh content and our developers consistently troubleshooting and updating the application.
