From the Festival Director

Street Art is a rapidly growing creative practice that has existed in many forms and cultures. One such legacy is the 1920's Mexican Muralism movement and luminary artists such as Diego Rivera. Street Art also has contemporary roots linked to the rise of graffiti in 1970's New York, and in more recent times we have witnessed a shift in social attitudes towards Street Art through the mainstream adoration of Banksy. With this growth comes innovation in the artform and diversity in artists. Although Muralists around the world are experimenting with scale, locations, and styles, there remains a shared and enduring core element of human expression and communication. Street Art is a form of art that is 'in and of its place', both in terms of social context and phusical location. Street artworks are created in public space, and often by artists who have a direct connection to the communities of that location. This allows artists to generate a site responsive dialogue as part of a reclaiming of public space and voice. Through our festival program. Brisbane Street Art Festival is committed to providing opportunities for these emerging and established artists. We seek to support artistic freedom of expression and voice, which we believe enriches the built environment and social fabric of greater Brisbane.


Some of the most rewarding outcomes from the 2018 festival was the knowledge sharing between local, interstate and international artists. We had a number of the world's most respected street artists, who grew up in, and still call Brisbane home, produce highlight works and run workshops. They generously shared their experience and skills with the broader Brisbane community. 2019 will be our fourth year and we hope to keep building on these amazing outcomes and to facilitate even greater opportunities for the local creative economy.

Building on our previous engagement with Indigenous Street Artists we acknowledge that First Nations people were the first street artists on this land, stretching back for thousands of years. We are proud to have a number of Indigenous artists in the 2019 festival program, and collaborating with Digi Youth Arts on their 'where we stand' program; supporting creative outcomes across regional Queensland communities.

BSAF is rapidly growing into one of the largest Street Art festivals in Australia. We are incredibly excited to be rolling out this year's festival that includes a mural program featuring over 45 new works. Running alongside this is our largest ever events program, stretching over the sixteen festival days across the Brisbane landscape. Highlights include the Festival Launch at the newly opened Howard Smith Wharves precinct, the annual Within These Walls group exhibition at West Village, and the Festival Closing Party at the BSAF hub in Toombul. The engagement program is also growing with the launch of the BSAF Pop-up Studio at the Toombul hub. The Studio will be open for the festival duration, hosting a variety of workshops and artist talks for all ages and skill levels.

The growth of the festival program is possible due to the passion and dedication of the festival team, volunteers, artists and supporters in the community. A massive thank you to everyone who has contributed to, or attended BSAF over the past three years. We are grateful for all your support. BSAF would also like to acknowledge the support from the Queensland Government through Arts Queensland, and Brisbane City Council's ongoing support and belief in our festival vision.

This event is inclusive to all who identify as female.



SCRIBBLE SLAM

There will be two rounds of the art battle project; one on the second Sunday of the festival and the second at the Festival Closing Party on Friday 17th of May. We'll see the iconic Scribble Slam return in Ric's Backyard and the Toombul Centre. The event showcases two artists battling against each other, working with a 90 minute time limit, and each creating their own artwork on a large canvas. The goal is to bridge the gap between graffiti and authorised public sculpture/art. Blu enjoys placing pieces in hard to reach places, as well as very public areas, the brilliant blue contrasting against the structures of the urban environment.

Blu's work for this festival will be harking back to their very first pieces they placed around Brisbane: Sprouts and organic forms growing from side spaces and alleyways, beautifying those areas that are often neglected, but always visible in our periphery.

BONETA-MARIE MABO

Boneta-Marie Mabo, Piadram/Munbarra, a proud Aboriginal and Torres Strait woman, a sugar slave descendant, a prison abolitionist, and a lover of fashion and art. In 2017 she collaborated with the Royal Australian Mint in the design of a circulating commemorative 50c coin to mark the 50th anniversary of the 1967 referendum and the 25th anniversary of the High Court Mabo decision. In 2016 she was the inaugural artist-in-residence for the State Library of Queensland's kuril dhagun Indigenous centre, in 2015 she won People's Choice award in the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Telstra Art Award for her art celebrating the life of her activist grandfather, the late Eddie Koiki Mabo. For the past five years the award winning contemporary artist has lead the Sisters Inside Young Indigenous Art Program. Sisters Inside, an independent community organisation, which exists to advocate for the human rights of women and girls in the criminal justice system. She holds an Undergraduate Degree in Visual Arts from Deakin University. Boneta-Marie most recent solo exhibition in 2018 was 'Immersed' a collection of portraits of First Nations women that celebrates resistance against patriarchal colonialism

Casey is the artist and designer behind their label CHABOO and has created many graphic design pieces for North Coast Aboriginal Corporation for Community Health (NCACCH), Menzies School of Health Research, Sentencing Council Queensland, YFS, ATSICH, Femeconomy, The Brisbane Aboriginal & Dirres Strait Islander Community Controlled Housing Authority (BATSICCHA), and Queensland Performing Arts Centre (QPAC).

IROK

Irok was an accomplished artist from a young age growing up in the western suburbs of Brisbane with a graffiti and street art background. This introduced the artist to experimenting with all types of mediums outside of just spray paint. His work now has a strong, confident message and representation of his life and the surroundings around all of us seen through his eyes and presented to others in a very real, moving and visceral fashion with his unique use of brush and acrylic house paint. Originally the house paint watered down to save money, but this slowly became part of the the tell tale signs of the free flowing slightly chaotic yet organic splatters and drips that are generally outside the usual portrait artists focus on fine detail that became his signature work he is known for today. Irok sees his work as being progressive and versatile.

HAYLEY WELSH

British born artist Hauley Welsh, has established herself as one of the newest creatives in the street art scene, creating her whimsical artworks across the globe. Quoted by Jetstar Magazine as being one of the 'Top Ten Street Artists You Should Know By Now' and having exhibited internationally in Berlin, London and New York, she is renown for her surreal, wide-eyed characters, reminding us all to 'Listen To Your Little Voice'. There is something quite fantastical and a little bit dark lurking in Hayley's work. Utilising various surfaces from walls to found objects as her canvas, she reveals curious creatures, so cute theu can't be trusted. With their ominous softness, Hayley explores inner voices of self doubt and fear, weaving a poignant narrative into every piece - a message for each person to reflect on in the moment. Hayley's unique style displays a technical approach, mixed with nostalgia and humour. Surface images that might otherwise seem inviting, have an other-wordly quality that take them places beyond the image in front of us. Her playful aura eludes to a childlike innocence, yet this is juxtaposed with darker undertones of the unknown and abuss.

KARRI MCPHERSON

Karri McPherson's paintings use geometric art in response to site-specific environments. She uses hard-edge abstraction to break down the boundaries of perception by responding to her immediate surroundings and creating designs based on the location. Karri's' works aim to celebrate the beauty of geometric art by infusing communities with her simple, yet intricate, hard-edge compositions.

Through exploring different hard-edge forms, colours, tones and lines, Karri's works demonstrate how shape can work in relation to space to influence how we experience our surrounds. The works investigate architectural nuances and their potential, with her designs aiming to incorporate qualities from the surrounding environment.

Karri continues to investigate ideas around visual perception by exploring the boundaries and limitations of physical space. As she incorporates the surface and frame of a structure into her paintings, the works have become a reverie about spatial relationships, straddling the divide between art and architecture.

James Khati is a Kathmandu based artist who is originally from Chitwan district of Nepal. He calls himself more as a visual poet working on the ideas of memorabilia, as he is very open to ideas, situations and opinions and believes that he is still finding his own voice for storytelling in a very experimental and physically cathartic manner. Art Atlas is a crowd–sourced archival and documentation system for public art around the world. Built by Vast Yonder in collaboration with BSAF, and made possible through funding by the 2016 Brisbane City Council Innovation Award, Art Atlas has grown from a simple concept into a worldwide platform for street artists and the general public to display their own works and appreciate pieces in an adventurous map context.

Users upload photos of street artworks they discover with geographic reference on Art Atlas's world map, making it possible for other users to either browse a city's dappled works online or find the physical work itself. By including databases of artists featured, street artists are also given a platform to share their hidden portfolio in a way previously unheard of, ultimately creating a worldwide street art community which allows artists to gain recognition throughout the globe. Art Atlas is live on Apple Itunes App Store and Google play, growing through increasing numbers of artists and art devotees uploading fresh content and our developers consistently troubleshooting and updating the application.






